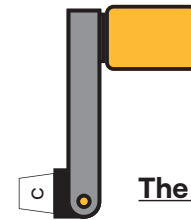
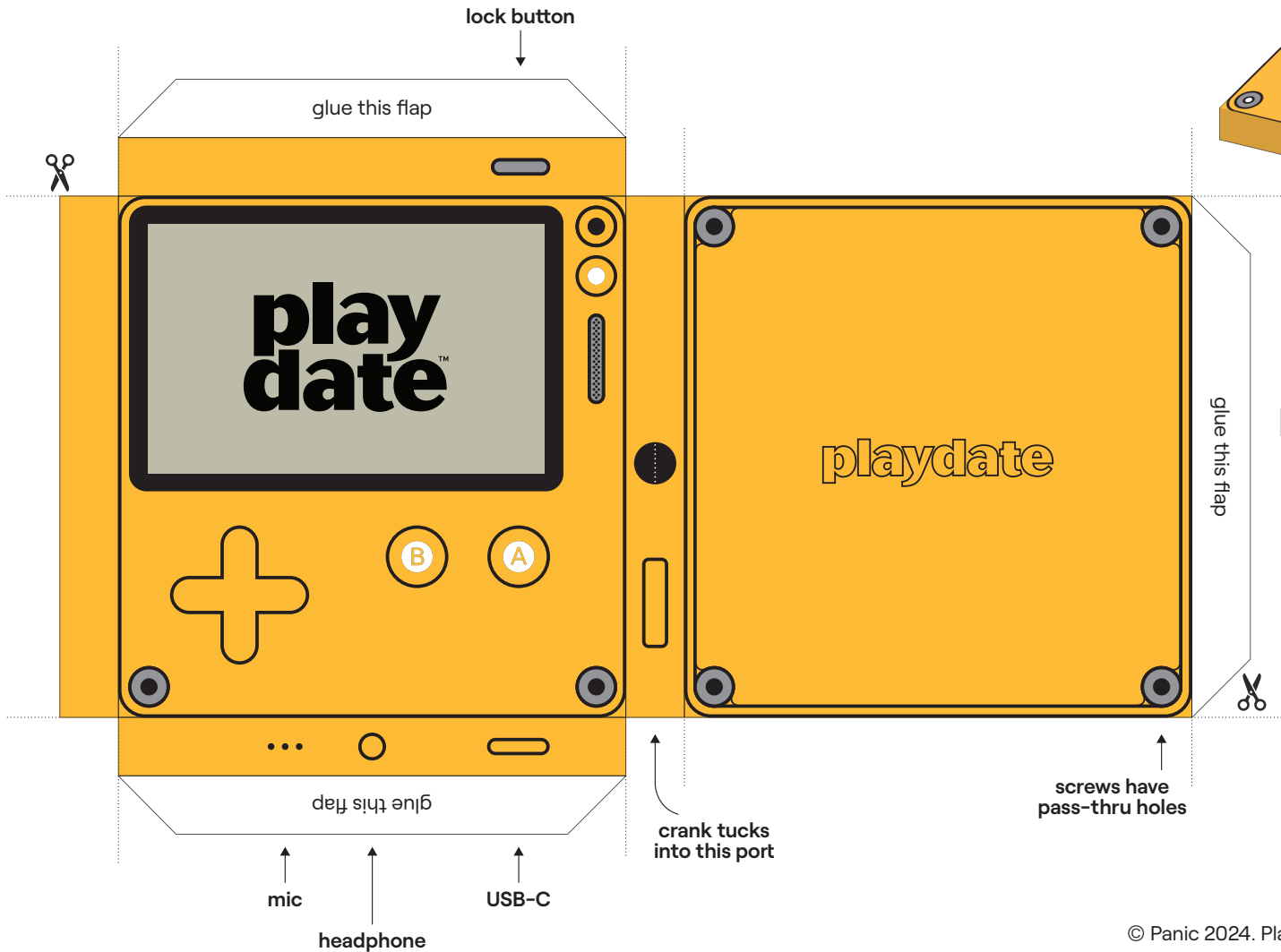
Here's a Paper Playdate While You Wait!

We thought you might get a kick out of cutting out and assembling this life-size paper version of Playdate to hold until you can hold the real one. Hopefully not much longer!

(Double check you're printing at 100%!
A credit card should be as wide as this outline.)

The Basics

- First, well, you'll need a printer. (We know, we know.)
- When you print, be sure to print at 100% scale.
- Carefully cut all the way around the edges.
- Smaller scissors might work better.
- Fold along the dotted fold lines.
- Then glue the flaps.
- Enjoy!



The Crank

- Fold the "c" tab and glue it to the side with the black circle, or,
- Cut a slit along the dotted line in the black circle and insert the "c" tab into it, or,
- Glue a toothpick to the crank to make it turn, or...
- Come up with a brand new design!
